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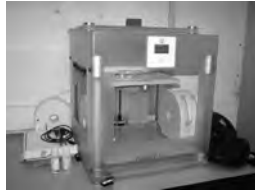
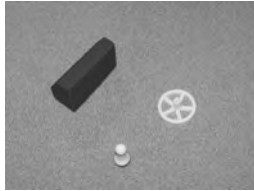

The WEST IRONDEQUOIT FOUNDATION (WIF) is a not-for-profit organization established in 1987 to receive gifts, bequests and donations in order to provide funding to enhance the educational programs of the West Irondequoit Central School District.

It raises funds to underwrite teacher-initiated grants for projects, equipment and programs that cannot be supported by the district's annual operating budget.

The foundation conducts an annual campaign each fall and sponsors a golf tournament each summer (Save the date: June 24, 2016). Since 1990, the foundation has granted more than \$860,000 to WICSD. Recent grants have included:

2012-15 – Innovations and Interventions Initiative

Designed to introduce students in grades 7-12 to the world of advanced manufacturing, the program includes site visits to local companies for students and teachers, internships, and support for teachers as they incorporate authentic problems and exercises into STEM class work. This program offers opportunities to expand experiences for our students while addressing a real need in our community.

Students have participated in summer camps and internships and visited local businesses and colleges. The grant allowed our technology department to purchase 3-D printers so that students can design and create prototypes in class. It has also provided funding for robotics clubs at Dake Junior High and Irondequoit High School.



2015 – Link Crew Training

Link Crew is a freshman transition program that welcomes freshmen and makes them feel comfortable throughout the first year of their high school experience. Built on the belief that students can help students succeed, Link Crew trains members of the junior and senior classes to be Link Leaders. As positive role models, Link Leaders are motivators and leaders who guide the freshmen in discovering what it takes to be successful.

2015 – Critical Thinking through Critical Making

The grant funded a new kiln housed at Dake Junior High, available to all students in the district. The use of clay fosters engagement, participation and creativity through dynamic three dimensional sculpturing.



Enhancing Educational Excellence
